Note: Bidders are required to acknowledge this and all Addenda in Section 6(a) of the Bid Form.

This Addendum consists of a change to the Contract Document to clarify when Performance and Payment Securities must be submitted to CRRA and CRRA's responses to written questions received by 3:00 p.m., January 13, 2009, the due date specified in the Contract Documents.

In addition, a list of potential bidders who attended the Pre-Bid Conference And Site Tour is attached.

1. PERFORMANCE AND PAYMENT SECURITY

Currently, Section 7.1 of the Agreement indicates that Performance and Payment Securities must be submitted to CRRA prior to the execution of a Request For Work. However, Section 7.2 of the Agreement requires that they be submitted to CRRA within 10 days after CRRA issues the Notice of Award.

The first sentence of Section 7.2 of the Agreement is hereby revised as follows:

“Prior to the execution of a Request Form Work, Contractor shall furnish CRRA with the following.”

2. QUESTIONS AND CRRA RESPONSES

The following are the questions submitted to CRRA by 3:00 p.m., January 13, 2009 and CRRA's responses to them.

1.	Question	If a bidder has different equipment pricing for each site, how should that be handled?
	Answer	<p>If a bidder has different equipment pricing for each site, it should use multiple copies of the appropriate Bid Payment Rate Schedule Form and place a check mark in the landfill to which it pertains. For example, if a bidder has different rates for the Ellington Landfill and the Wallingford Landfill, it would submit two copies of the “Bid Payment Rate Schedule Form – Ellington, Wallingford and Waterbury Landfills,” one for the Ellington Landfill and one for the Wallingford Landfill with a check mark in the box for the appropriate landfill for each Form.</p> <p>Bidders should remember that all Work under the Agreement will be pursuant to a Request For Work negotiated between CRRA and the successful bidder(s). One of the items that will be included in the cost estimate portion of a Request For Work will be a charge for mobilization/demobilization. Therefore, if a bidders pricing differs for each site because of the cost of getting the equipment/operator to and from the site, that difference should not be reflected in the rates included in the Bid Payment Rate Schedule Form. Rather, they will be accounted for in the mobilization/demobilization charge for each specific Request For Work.</p>

2.	Question	May we obtain the list of bidders?
	Answer	CRRA indicated that the sign-in sheet for the mandatory pre-bid conference was attached to Addendum 1, but neglected to do so. It is attached to this Addendum 2.
3.	Question	How important is it and what emphasis will be place on a bidder's strengths and deficiencies in regards to affirmative action/minority/small business aspects of this RFB?
	Answer	As indicated in the Instructions To Bidders, CRRA is an Equal Opportunity and Affirmative Action employer and does not discriminate in its hiring, employment, contracting or business practices. Also as indicated in the Instructions To Bidders, CRRA is required to consider factors related to affirmative action in rating a bid. As with all of the criteria on which CRRA rates a bid, CRRA is not prepared to disclose the exact weighting that will be assigned to any particular criterion.
4.	Question	How am I to carry a per hour price for operator and equipment, including pollution insurance and bonds, if I don't know how many hours I will be working?
	Answer	<p>It is up to each individual bidder to determine how it accounts for its costs within its bid. A successful bidder must provide proof of the insurance coverage specified in the Agreement before CRRA will execute the three-year Agreement with said bidder. Bidders should be aware that execution of the Agreement does not necessarily guarantee that a successful bidder will be selected to perform any work.</p> <p>Performance and Payment Securities are not required prior to executing the Agreement, but will be required prior to CRRA authorizing any work under a Request for Work. As indicated in Section 1 above, Section 7.2 of the Agreement has been changed to reflect this. A successful bidder could include in the cost estimate for a Request For Work the cost of the Performance and Payment Securities, but Requests For Work will be awarded on a competitive basis and one of the primary factors that will be considered in doing so it the cost estimate.</p>
