## **CRRA Receives Financial Reporting Achievement Award**

Agency's 'Excellence' Recognized for the 11th Straight Year

HARTFORD, Conn. – For the 11th consecutive year, the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) has bestowed its Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting on the Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority (CRRA) in recognition of the CRRA's most recent Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2003.
