Garbage Museum to Hold Family Fun Day March 18

STRATFORD, Conn. – The Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority Garbage Museum will hold its next Family Fun Day event on Saturday, March 18, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. All activities are free of charge.

Visitors may participate in tours of the museum, explore exhibits, create a recycled rainbow craft and catch a bird's-eye view of the CRRA container recycling facility. The recycled craft, using cling vinyl, colorful rainbow pieces and a lucky pot-of-gold sticker, will decorate a window. Also, Storm, mascot of the Bridgeport Sound Tigers hockey team will make a special guest appearance.

The Garbage Museum features Trash-o-Saurus, a one-ton dinosaur made from salvaged items. Guests may take part in scavenger hunts searching for “found” treasures on Trash-o-Saurus. Additionally, families may participate in an all-time favorite activity, Trash Bash.
