

ADDENDUM NO. 1 Issued August 15, 2007

TO

"REQUEST FOR BIDS FOR REPLACEMENT OF TROMMEL THRUST RINGS AT THE MID-CONNECTICUT WASTE PROCESSING FACILITY" (Bid Number 08-O-001)

(RFB Issued July 23, 2007)

Note: Bidder is required to acknowledge this and all Addenda in Section 6(a) of the Proposal Form.

This Addendum consists of the Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority's (CRRA) responses to written questions that have been received by CRRA through August 10, 2007, the deadline for questions as specified in the RFB.

1.	Question	May a bidder bid on just the base work (replacement of two trommel thrust rings) and not the optional work (replacement of up to six additional trommel thrust rings)?
	Answer	No. The RFB is for the base work <u>and</u> the optional work. The optional work will be performed at CRRA's sole and absolute discretion. Bidders must submit bids on both the base work and the optional work. It is up to bidders to decide whether or not to bid on the manufacture of the trommel thrust rings <u>and/or</u> the installation of the trommel thrust rings. However, bidders must submit bids for the manufacture and/or installation of all eight trommel thrust rings (the two base bid rings and the six optional work rings).

2.	Question	The base bid is for two trommel thrust rings and the optional work is for six additional rings. The price for the base bid (two rings) is likely to be less than \$100,000, the threshold for prevailing wage requirements. The price for the total bid (two base bid rings and six additional optional rings) is likely to more than \$100,000. Do the prevailing wage requirements apply?
	Answer	Because of the possibility that all eight trommel thrust rings will be replaced during the term of the contract, all bids must meet the Connecticut prevailing wage requirements.
3.	Question	What dollar amount should bidders use for the Bid Bond, the price for the base bid or the price for the base bid plus the price for the optional work?
	Answer	For purposes of determining the amount of the Bid Bond, a bidder should use its total bid price, that is, the base bid price <u>plus</u> the bid price for the optional work.
