This Addendum consists of the Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority's (CRRA) responses to written questions received by CRRA by 5:00 p.m., Monday, March 21, 2011, the deadline specified in the Instructions to Bidders for the submission of written questions.

1. RESPONSES TO QUESTIONS

1.1	Question	When will CRRA or member towns start converting carts to 96 gallons?
	Answer	At this time there is no set schedule for member towns to convert to the larger 96-gallon curbside containers used to facilitate single-stream recycling. Even so, the use or non-use of 96-gallon containers has no bearing on the operation and maintenance of the Stratford IPC as a transfer station as contemplated by this RFB. Whether or not recyclables are delivered to the Stratford IPC on a single-stream or dual-stream basis, all of the material will be transported to the Hartford RRC for processing.
1.2	Question	The Stratford IPC is permitted to receive 500 tons/day. Can the Mid-Connecticut Regional Recycling Facility receive 500 tons/day on top of the current daily receipts?
	Answer	It is estimated that during the period of time that the Stratford IPC will be operated as a transfer station, a maximum of 600 tons/week or 120 tons/day of recyclables will be delivered and subsequently transported to the Hartford RRC for processing. This is well below the Hartford RRC's permitted capacity taking into account the current volume of material delivered to the Hartford RRC.
1.3	Question	Is Contractor required to pay property taxes to the Town of Stratford?
	Answer	No.
