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## Garbage Museum to Hold Family Fun Day May 19

Museum Features Exhibits, Tours, Crafts and View of Processing Center - All Free

STRATFORD, Conn. – The Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority Garbage Museum will hold another popular Family Fun Day event on May 19. Families and scouts are invited to participate in tours of the museum, explore exhibits and create a craft made from recycled materials. The recycled craft provides a list of recyclables glued onto a refrigerator magnet and serves as a reminder of items that should be placed in a recycle bin.

Guests can visit with Trash-o-Saurus, a one-ton dinosaur made from salvaged items. Visitors take part in scavenger hunts by searching for re-used treasures on the dinosaur. Additionally, families may join in an all-time favorite activity, Trash Bash and view the CRRA container recycling facility.

"The activities are fun and engaging for families," said Sotoria Montanari, education supervisor. "We are open for a limited number of Saturdays throughout the year, so this day presents an opportunity for families to see what the Garbage Museum has to offer."
