- (a) Deferred contribution, since \$3M of the funds would not be required until fiscal year 2011.
- (b) The MDC has not provided support for their \$12M claim.
- (c) Updated the estimate for items missed in the presentation.
- (d) Legal support provided statement the lease payment would not be required for the entire fiscal year.
- (e) Cash availability impact of the \$3M State Bond Commission Funds (Impacts FY09 and FY10). Governor notifed CRRA on 02/20/08 that the Bond Commission was expected to approve \$3M on February 29, 2008. The Bond Commission agenda was issued 02/25/08. Receipt of funds is expected to occur in mid FY09.
- (f) Authority believes increases are too high and will be negotiated down during the upcoming budget meetings with the MDC.
- (g) The Authority plans to defer certain capital projects until FY10, unless additional funding becomes available.
- (h) Maintain the recycling credit at \$10 per ton which is unchanged from the FY08 rate.
- (i) Reduce extent of single stream marketing campaign since the construction will not be complete until mid FY09.
