

Public Notice of Solicitation

MSW Generator Seeks Landfill Disposal Capacity For 120,000 tons per year of MSW

The Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority owns a Municipal Waste Combustion Facility located in Hartford, CT. This waste-to-energy facility is a Refuse Derived Fuel (“RDF”) facility. In the process of producing the RDF in the front end waste processing facility, a residue is generated. This residue, known as “process residue”, is comprised of Municipal Solid Waste (“MSW”) that is less than 1” particle size. The material is regulated by the State of Connecticut as MSW and is currently deposited at an MSW landfill in Hartford, CT. Also, in the process of producing the RDF, large “non-processible” items (oversized MSW) are removed and rejected from the waste processing facility. This material is also currently disposed of at the MSW landfill in Hartford, CT. The available capacity at the current facility used for disposal of these two wastestreams is nearing capacity.

CRRA is soliciting interest from landfill owners/operators that can provide disposal capacity for approximately 100,000 tons per year of CRRA’s Process Residue, and approximately 20,000 tons per year of CRRA’s non-processible material, and directly with whom CRRA would execute a contract for disposal of this material. CRRA anticipates commencing shipments to an alternate landfill in late summer 2006.
