Response to a Question Received

Question:	The RFQ reads like an RFP. My experience with the State has been that use of an RFQ can be effective in determining critical information prior to issuing an RFP, but that does not seem to be the case here. Are you substituting an RFP with this document, or will you be issuing an RFP after you have reviewed responses from vendors?
Response:	CRRA uses the terms “proposal” and “proposer” in a “Request for Qualifications” (“RFQ”) simply for linguistic convenience. The current solicitation is an RFQ. CRRA does not intend to issue an additional “Request for Proposals” or other solicitation document in connection with this RFQ. Rather, CRRA will select one or more individuals/firms who respond to this RFQ and enter into a contract(s) with the selected proposer(s). As the need for services arises, CRRA will utilize the “Request for Services” form to award <u>actual</u> work to the successful proposer(s).
