NOTICE TO FIRMS REQUEST FOR BIDS

Transportation and Disposal of Municipal Solid Waste

The Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority ("CRRA") is a quasi-public entity of the State of Connecticut that is responsible for implementing the State Solid Waste Management Plan and is currently providing solid waste disposal and recycling services to more than 100 municipalities in the state.

CRRA will be soliciting bids from solid waste disposal facility owners/operators (i.e., resource recovery facilities and landfills) and solid waste transportation companies that can provide transportation and disposal services for between 101,000 and 266,000 tons per year of municipal solid waste ("MSW") from municipalities in southwestern Connecticut (i.e., Fairfield County). The actual amount of MSW to be disposed will depend on the number of municipalities that elect to take advantage of the services to be provided pursuant to this Request For Bids ("RFB"). The MSW will be pickup up by the successful bidder at between three and seven municipally-operated MSW transfer stations and transported by the successful bidder, using the successful bidder's transportation equipment, to the successful bidder's disposal facility. Disposal services will be provided for a six-year term beginning January 1, 2009 and ending December 31, 2014, with the option for two three-year extensions at CRRA's sole and absolute discretion.

Firms interested in submitting a bid should submit a Notice Of Interest Form to CRRA by February 22, 2008. Instructions for submission of the Form are on the Form itself. CRRA will provide all of the RFB documents to firms from which it has received a Notice Of Interest Form. CRRA anticipates that the RFB will be ready for distribution by February 22, 2008.
