This Addendum consists of the Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority's (CRRA) responses to written questions that were received by CRRA by 3:00 p.m., July 29, 2009, the deadline specified in the "Instructions to Firms/Individuals" for the submission of written questions.

<b>1.</b>	Question	As part of the Services under the "Municipal Government Liaison Services Agreement," does CRRA expect to require its consultant to provide technical advice regarding current and future solid waste issues, and if so, can you anticipate whether that effort would include planning, engineering, operations, or all of these?
	Answer	No, CRRA does not expect that the firm(s)/individual(s) selected will be asked to provide technical advice regarding current and future solid waste issues.
<b>2.</b>	Question	As part of the Services under the "Municipal Government Liaison Services Agreement," does CRRA project a need for field capabilities or testing of materials?
	Answer	No, CRRA does not project a need for field capabilities or testing of materials from the firm(s)/individual(s) selected to provide municipal government liaison services.
<b>3.</b>	Question	As part of the Services under the "Municipal Government Liaison Services Agreement," is the ability to provide independent judgments or analytical opinions desired?
	Answer	CRRA may, depending on the circumstances, ask the firm(s)/individual(s) selected to provide independent judgments or analytical opinions in issues pertaining to the consultant's expertise and scope of services.
<b>4.</b>	Question	As part of the Services under the "Municipal Government Liaison Services Agreement," does CRRA expect to require legal support with issues such as site acquisition, permit assistance, contract negotiations, or others?
	Answer	No, CRRA does not expect to require legal support from the firm(s)/individual(s) selected to provide municipal government liaison services.
<b>5.</b>	Question	As part of the Services under the "Municipal Government Liaison Services Agreement," does CRRA expect to require public and or media relations capabilities for making the case for an expected CRRA action to communities or citizen groups, or for acting as the public face of CRRA?
	Answer	No, CRRA does not expect the firm(s)/individual(s) selected to provide municipal government liaison services to provide public and or media relations capabilities or to act as the public face of CRRA. CRRA may, however, ask the firm(s)/individual(s) selected to provide input into the formulation of strategies and tactics for public and/or media relations.
