CRRA Expands Fall Electronics Recycling Schedule; Collection Added in Stratford on Nov. 13

The Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority will hold has added another date to its fall series of household electronics recycling collections.

CRRA will collect used electronics items such as computers, monitors, cell phones, televisions, VCRs, copiers, fax machines, printers, radios and sound equipment on Saturday, Nov. 13, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the CRRA Children's Garbage Museum, 1410 Honeyspot Road Extension, Stratford.

The collection is open to residents of Bridgeport Project towns, including Bethany, Bridgeport, Darien, East Haven, Easton, Fairfield, Greenwich, Milford, Monroe, New Canaan, Norwalk, Orange, Shelton, Stamford, Stratford, Trumbull, Weston, Westport, Wilton and Woodbridge.
