CRRA Expands Fall Electronics Recycling Schedule; Collections Added in Waterbury, Hamden

HARTFORD, Conn. – The Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority has added more dates to its fall series of household electronics recycling collections.

The full remaining schedule includes:

- **Saturday, Oct. 23, in Waterbury**, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Naugatuck Valley Community College, 750 Chase Parkway. This collection is open to residents of Mid-Connecticut Project-member towns only.
- **Saturday, Oct. 30, in Hamden**, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Hamden High School, 2040 Dixwell Avenue. This collection is open to residents of Hamden, Wallingford, North Haven, Cheshire and Meriden only.

Those interested in participating should call their city or town public works departments to see whether their towns are eligible and which collection will accept their recyclables.
