CRRA Adds Wallingford Electronics Recycling Dec. 3 Collection Also for Residents of Meriden, Cheshire, Hamden, North Haven

WALLINGFORD, Conn. – In response to a rapidly increasing demand, the Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority will provide residents of Wallingford, Meriden, Cheshire, Hamden and North Haven the answer with another of its popular consumer electronics recycling collections on Saturday, Dec. 3, 9 a.m.-1 p.m., at Cytec Industries, 528 South Cherry Street.

A collection held Oct. 29 in Wallingford drew a record crowd. CRRA officials counted 721 participants who dropped off non-working and obsolete computers, VCRs, cell phones, televisions and other electronic devices. Dozens more had to be turned away because they could not be accommodated.

“The demand for electronics recycling is big and growing every day, so we’re working to make sure that everyone who wants safely dispose of their old devices can do so,” said Thomas P. Gaffey, CRRA manager of recycling and enforcement.
