Over 200 Attend CRRA Garbage Museum Family Fun Day Next Event Scheduled for Saturday, May 19

STRATFORD, Conn. – Over 200 visitors attended a Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority Garbage Museum Family Fun Day event on March 10. Families and scouts participated in tours of the museum, explored exhibits and created a kazoo craft made from recycled materials.

“Families and scout groups were engaged in activities that were interactive and fun for all ages,” said Sotoria Montanari, education supervisor. The Garbage Museum’s next Family Fun Day event is scheduled for Saturday, May 19.

Visitors got an up-close look at Trash-o-Saurus, a one-ton dinosaur made from salvaged items where visitors took part in scavenger hunts searching for re-used treasures. Additionally, families joined in an all-time favorite activity, Trash Bash and caught a bird’s-eye view of the CRRA container recycling facility.
