**Stratford 3rd Grader Alexandra Sciallo
Wins Garbage Museum Flyer Contest
Stamford Student Max Kitay Takes Second Place**

STRATFORD, Conn. – Alexandra Sciallo, a Grade 3 student from St. Mark School in Stratford, won first place in a recycling flyer contest sponsored by the Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority Garbage Museum and the Southwest Regional Recycling Operating Committee. A total of 144 participants submitted entries.

Taking second place was Max Kitay of the Bi-Cultural School in Stamford.

The winning flyers feature the benefits of recycling mixed paper using illustrations, slogans and an array of colors. The flyers will be reproduced into stickers that will be distributed to promote school and residential recycling.

During an awards ceremony on Feb. 28 at the Garbage Museum, the winners received a Borders gift certificate, recognition certificate and an assortment of items made from recycled materials. The artists were inspired by their teachers and utilized color pallets that enhanced the environmental messages.

“The winning flyers will assist us in spreading the word about the importance of recycling junk mail, said Sotoria Montanari, education supervisor.”
