## Implement SWMP

Specifics	<ul> <li>Planning, design, financing, construction of facilities needed to implement state Solid Waste Management Plan</li> <li>CRRA "shall be granted all powers necessary to fulfill these purposes" in accordance with the state Solid Waste Management Plan</li> <li>Revise and update as may be necessary "that portion of the [SWMP] defined as the 'solid waste management system'"</li> <li>CRRA "shall have power to do all things necessary in accordance with the" SWMP</li> </ul>

Specifics	<ul> <li>"Assistance with and coordination of efforts directed toward source separation for recycling purposes"</li> <li>CRRA's activities shall conform to the SWMP:         <ul> <li>✓ Major statewide and local public outreach campaigns</li> <li>✓ Promotional materials for local use</li> <li>✓ School-based education programs</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Sources	<ul> <li>CGS §22a-262 (a) (1)</li> <li>Note: SWMP refers to education as a means of reaching state</li> <li>State Solid Waste Management Plan pp. E-2, E-5, E-11</li> <li>Note: SWMP refers to education as a means of reaching state diversion goals more than 300 times</li> </ul>
Funding	<ul> <li>CGS §22a-262 (a) (1): CRRA must generate "revenues sufficient to provide for the support of the authority and its operations on a self-sustaining basis"</li> <li>CGS §22a-269 (a): CRRA may issue bonds or notes "Subject to the approval of the Treasurer of the state, and any other limitations of" CGS Chapter 446e</li> <li>Note: CRRA funds its education programs through its operating revenues as well as through grants, contributions and user fees.</li> </ul>




## DEEP-CRRA Functional Relationship Overlaps
