Dear Speaker Donovan and President Williams:

Attached please find the annual report of operations of the Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority (the "Authority") to the Connecticut General Assembly for the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2013. as required by Connecticut General Statutes Section 22a-263 (the "Statute").

The Authority is responsible for implementing solid waste disposal and resource recovery systems and facilities throughout the State of Connecticut (the "State") in accordance with the State Solid Waste Management Plan. The Authority is comprised of separate and distinct, comprehensive solid waste disposal project systems located throughout the State. Therefore, the Statute requirements are reported separately for each project. The Authority had Municipal Service Agreements ("MSAs") with 70 municipalities for use of the Mid-Connecticut Project facilities. Most of the MSAs expired on November 15, 2012. Several former Mid-Connecticut Project towns and private haulers have signed new MSA with the Authority's Connecticut Solid Waste System ("CSWS") effective November 16, 2012, following expiration of the Mid-Connecticut Project on November 15, 2012.


